In the Junior Area, we have been getting to know each other through games and movement activities. The students have settled well into the new school year and forming friendships. Our new Foundation students have been buddied up with a Year 6 student so that they have someone to assist them if an adult is not available. The Buddy Program will run each Thursday afternoon where they will work together on different projects.

The Juniors have actively had a voice by voting for things that they would like in the classroom. They have agreed to have a bell chime for when I need their attention, and that helps our voices!

We have begun learning different sounds, /m/ and /s/ to start with, also numbers 1 and 2 representing them in different ways. The older students have been doing some revision of sounds, structure of a sentence, and 2-digit numbers whilst organising their tubs and equipment.

As a class, we have decided to set a goal of reading 100 books by the end of the term and we are well on our way with 23 books already read.

They are full of wonder and amazing ideas and I can't wait to see the growth over the year.



#### Hey kids, we had so much fun last series, we're making more episodes of HARD QUIZ KIDS!


